About the Conference Organisers

Makerere University: Established in 1922 as a humble technical school, Makerere University is one of the oldest and most prestigious Universities in Africa. The College soon began offering various other courses in Medical Care, Agriculture and Veterinary. It expanded over the years to become a Center for Higher Education in East Africa in 1935. In 1937, the College started developing into an institution of higher education, offering post-school certificate courses. In 1949, it became a University College affiliated to the University College of London. Subsequently, in 1963 it became the University of East Africa, offering courses leading to general degrees of the University of London. On July 1, 1970, Makerere became an independent national university of the Republic of Uganda, offering undergraduate and postgraduate courses leading to its own awards. Today Makerere University has one college and twenty-one faculties/institutes/schools offering not only day but also evening and external study programmes to a student body of about 35,000 undergraduates and 2,000 postgraduates (both Ugandan and foreign). It is also a very active centre for research, and currently ranks among the top 15 Universities in Africa. The main campus is located on Makerere hill, 5 km North of Kampala City.

RUFORUM: The Regional Universities Forum for Capacity Building in Agriculture (RUFORUM) is an umbrella organization of 25 universities based in 15 countries in Eastern, Central and Southern Africa. It serves to promote integration of university research, training and outreach into Africa's development agenda. This task is addressed not only through better trained graduates entering the rural development work force, but also by conducting more relevant and development-oriented research that is directly linked to participatory outreach programmes.
