- 1975 University of Juba Act Promulgated
- 1977 October 6th, University of Juba inaugurated and classes started with four colleges
- 1978 College of Medicine established
- 1989 University displaced and relocated to Khartoum
- 2003 College of Art, Music and Drama repatriated wholly to Juba
- 2008 Science based first year students relocated to Juba
- 2011 Whole University repatriated to Juba
